

MICRONEEDLING PROCEDURE & IMPLICATIONS

The microneedling procedure involves puncture of tiny holes into the skin via sterile needles either in the form of a needling device or hand held 24-25 gauge needles. The procedure is designed to trigger biological resurfacing or sprouting of new skin cells. In the process collagen and elastin production are stimulated leaving smoother, softer, fresh skin. With repeated treatments the minimizing or full removal of scars, uneven skin tone and other skin imperfections such as large pores etc.

Treatments are given in therapy of 1-6 sessions on average. Each session is best taken every 2-3 weeks. Side effects are minimal and un-lasting. These include stinging tinges, redness, minor dermal swelling, itchy feeling (primarily in eczema cases) skin peeling (shedding of dead skin cells). Rare side effects include: PIH & healing complications (possible in diabetic cases but rare). Risks related to microneedling are quite low due to its biological nature. No chemicals or harmful rays are used and healing progresses naturally. The procedure has a 98% success rate among subscribers via different dermatological studies.
